NOTICE TO POTENTIAL CLASS MEMBERS OF REQUEST FOR CONTACT INFORMATION

You have been identified as someone who might be part of a potential class action lawsuit that is pending against Valley Presbyterian Hospital (“VPH”). The lawsuit was filed by a former Registered Nurse.

A lawsuit has been filed concerning alleged: (1) failure to pay premium wages for missed meal breaks; (2) failure to pay premium wages for missed rest breaks; (3) failure to pay overtime wages; (4) failure to pay all wages owed upon termination; (5) improper wage statements; and (6) unfair competition (violation of the California Business & Professions Code § 17200 *et seq.*) on behalf of current and former non-exempt registered nurses employed by VPH in California since March 12, 2005.

VPH denies the allegations asserted in the lawsuit and contends that it provided and continues to provide its non-exempt registered nurses with proper meal and rest breaks, or compensation in lieu thereof, that it paid and currently pays them properly and on time, that it provided and continues to provide them with paystubs containing all required information, and that it has not engaged and does not engage in any unfair business practices.

Plaintiff’s counsel is seeking to contact potential class members in order to gather information about the case. The Court ordered that your contact information will be provided to Plaintiff’s counsel unless you **timely** object to the disclosure of this information in the manner described below. This letter is being sent to you to determine if you object to Plaintiff’s counsel receiving your name and contact information.

If you do **not** want your name, address and telephone number to be provided to the Plaintiff’s counsel, you must complete the enclosed self-addressed stamped postcard and return it to Simpluris Inc. To be timely, the postcard must be postmarked on or before January 30, 2010 (which is 25 days from the date of the mailing of this notice). If you do not timely return the enclosed postcard, your name, your last known home address and home telephone number will be provided to the Plaintiff’s attorneys.

You have no obligation to speak to Plaintiff’s attorneys, VPH’s attorneys, or anyone else about this case. Whether or not you choose to speak to the attorneys and whether or not you return the enclosed postcard will not affect your right to participate, or not to participate, in the lawsuit. Your decision about whether or not to return the enclosed postcard will not negatively affect your employment with VPH in any way.

This Notice is not a communication from the Court and is not an expression of any opinion by the Court as to the merits of the claims or defense by either side in this case. Please do not contact the Court.
